- Where do we see bad news?
- How does Jesus bring good news?
- What can that say to our lives today?

- You may be out of options but you are never out of Hope
- Your defeats don't have to be defining
- Your pain can become your platform

Going deeper

The origins of the word 'gospel' go way back even before Christianity.

They have their roots in history, the announcement of good news is always tied to the reign of a king and a kingdom. The story of God is the story of 2 kingdoms.

The gospel of the kingdom of God is tied to the authority and ministry of Jesus.

Read these scriptures and try to draw out the characteristics, the hallmarks of the kingdom of God, this is the gospel, this is the good news!
